Active Cornwall have launched the Easter Time2Move Holiday Programme which aims to support families during the school holidays to ensure children have access to fun activities, healthy food and physical activity and to address those particular challenges for some families because of increased costs such as food, childcare and reduced income.

It brings together providers across Cornwall who put on a wide range of diverse activities that are fully funded for those eligible for benefits related, free school meals but available to all children aged 5 to 16.

Easter activities will run from April 3rd to the 7th and the 10th to the 14th and all children that attend will receive a healthy meal.

The Time2Move Holiday Programme for Easter 2023 is live. The programme offers fun physical activities, games and wider activities plus a funded meal for every child. All children are welcome to attend, and it is completely funded for children that are eligible for benefits-related Free School Meals. As a parent or guardian of a child eligible for benefits related, free school meals you will need your child's unique code in order to access the activities for free.
