## Dear Parents/Carers,

Today, the school turned spotty for Children in Need 2020. Thank you to all of your generous donations, we raised £151.26 for this wonderful cause. This week saw the start of our 'Catch Up' clubs, attendance was excellent. Thank you for your ongoing support with this.

Towan class has been learning about similarities and differences between different fruits and vegetables. They have also been learning about what is under the sea and the different features a shark has.

This week, Summers Class has started a new book called 'Iggy Peck Architect' which is about a child who likes building. As part of one of these sessions, the children were challenged to create a structure in groups using different types of building materials such as junk modelling or straws and playdough. The results can be seen on our class blog.

Porthcurnick class have been improving their drawing skills by looking for geometric shapes in pictures - they then applied this skill to observational drawings of stone age animals. In science, they have become paleontologists, chipping away at ice to free 'fossils', writing instructions to make amber 'jelly' fossils and then they created mould fossils using salt dough.

Portholland class thoroughly enjoyed their first hockey session and showed excellent skill and understanding on the rules. The children have also been very excited to begin work on writing their own legends after completing the book Beowulf by Michael Morpurgo.

Porthluney Class have been learning about Sir Isaac Newton and investigating the difference between mass and weight. They have also been completing their Ancient Greek pots - look on our blog to see the final products!

For your information, each class page has knowledge organisers, which show what your child/children will be learning in each subject this term. Please share these with your child/ren so that you can look at the key skills and knowledge they will be learning in each subject.

We have noticed that many children are arriving at school as early as 8.15am. The school is open from 8.40am, please can we politely request that pupils do not arrive earlier, as they are not supervised during this time. We have also noticed that many children and adults exit the school at the end of the school day through the middle of the car park. The car park is exceptionally busy so please can you ensure that the pavements are used so that we can avert an accident; a near miss has been reported to me this week. If you are travelling by car, vehicles should be reversed into spaces. There is further parking at the Social Club, which is only a minute's walk away from the school. Thank you for your cooperation with this as the safety of our pupils is paramount.

Last week, I emailed information regarding the nasal flu vaccine. All children in Primary Schools from Reception to year 6 (inclusive) will be offered the vaccine. The vaccination is free and recommended for young children; it is administered by a quick and simple spray up the nose. Please enter <a href="www.nhs.uk/child-flu">www.nhs.uk/child-flu</a> to access information explaining the vaccination programme which also includes details about the small number of children for whom the nasal vaccine is not appropriate. They are due to visit our school on Tuesday 24th November 2020. The code for your school is: EE142668. Please submit your consent form by Friday 20th November 2020 to ensure your child receives their vaccination. If you experience any problems accessing the form please telephone 01872 221105 and the team will be happy to help. Please note that as in previous years you must opt in to the programme. If a consent form is not submitted your child will not be vaccinated. For your information, the children's health screening services will be paused for the time being but hope to resume next year.

Please can all children ensure that they bring their reading record book, reading book and home reading book (if they have one) each day. Reading books are changed each Monday and Friday and there will be an opportunity to change library books each Monday for KS2 children and Friday for KS1. Unfortunately, we are only able to change books on these days due to the need for them to be quarantined between use. We ask that children read at least four times a week and that their reading record book is signed. Thank you
