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Dear Parent(s)/Carer(s),

It has been another busy week. Porthcurnick has been swimming, and, once again, staff commented on their impeccable behaviour. It is Portholland's turn to swim next week. I also attended the Truro Cathedral SongFest. It was so lovely to see pupils from our choir gathering with other schools to sing together after two years. It was quite an emotional event and pupils performed with tuneful confidence!

We are monitoring cases of Covid carefully as they continue to rise in Cornwall. However, with restrictions lifted, we are hoping to have our first end of term assembly for over two years. This will take place on Friday 8th April at 9.15am in the school hall - all being well! As part of this, we would like to hold an Easter raffle to raise money towards extracurricular activities and treats for our pupils. We would be most grateful for any donations towards this. We are becoming increasingly worried about the safety of pupils in the carpark and on the roads; particularly at the end of the day. We have had concerned members of the public and staff, who have witnessed some very near misses particularly involving some of the younger pupils. The health and safety of our pupils is paramount and we ask you to please supervise younger children carefully both in the carpark and in the village. Thank you.

Little Carne Nursery have really enjoyed learning about minibeasts this week. They made a wormery using soil and sand. They really enjoyed finding worms to live inside too. We have also been very independent with our snack time this week. The children have made their own pizza, poured their own milk and served their own cereal. We are also busy preparing some Easter songs to perform to parents. Can I remind all parents to ensure children are coming to Nursery with suitable shoes, not wellies. They are uncomfortable and do not support their feet. We are also discouraging children to sit in the 'w' position with their legs behind them. Again, this can cause damage to their hips later in life. If you see your child sitting like this at home, encourage them to sit with their feet in front of them. Thank you.

Towan Class has been learning about the life cycle of a butterfly. They have observed their own caterpillars and are able to link them to their book of the week, 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'. In maths, this week, the children have been learning and exploring doubles and I'm very impressed that they are beginning to make links with odd and even numbers. This week, the children also had the pleasure of working with Miss Mulroy to make their own willow wands.

It was World Poetry Day on Monday, and Summers Class have been learning about and writing different types of poems this week. They have enjoyed writing alliterative and acrostic poems and tried really hard at writing limericks. They have also enjoyed listening to Roald Dahl's Revolting Rhymes. This week, Summers Class have also learnt about Richard Trevithick, ahead of their trip to the Royal Cornwall Museum on Monday.

This week for Porthcurnick Class has been all about swimming! The swimming teachers were so complimentary about their behaviour - 'a pleasure to teach' and, consequently, their progress was amazing. We were so proud of them all.

Portholland Class have been continuing to enjoy their Journeys topic. This week, the children learnt about the American Gold Rush of the 1800s. The children enjoyed finding out about the experiences of early gold prospectors and found the story of Levi Strauss fascinating. We have also been busy with our DT project - please see our blog for photographs.

Porthluney Class have focused on their writing this week; they have redrafted a narrative piece based on the short video 'Beyond the Lines'. The children have really embraced all of their learning, including ambitious vocabulary and punctuation, as well as hard-hitting metaphors and similes to up-level their writing. 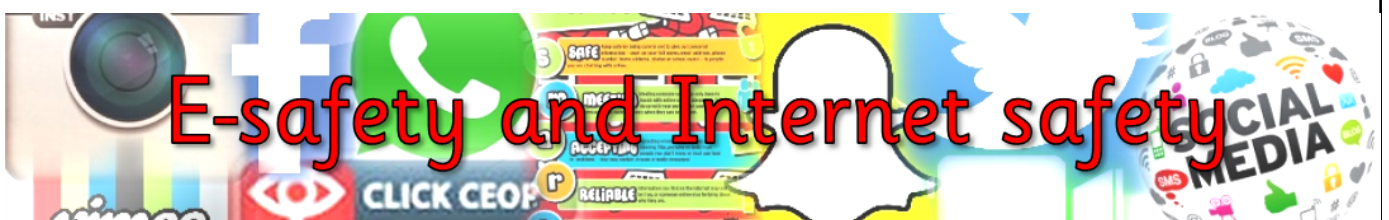
