This week, the school has had a focus on behaviour in the dining hall. In our assembly on Monday, pupils were able to talk about the desirable behaviours, expectations and table manners. This will continue to be monitored so that we can improve our pupils' dining experience.

Little Carne Nursery have enjoyed taking part in the 'Big Birdwatching Week'; learning about different garden birds, making bird houses and feeders and creating some fantastic artwork! They also enjoyed their PE lesson, using parachutes and celebrating Australia Day by making flags and learning about their native animals. Towan Class have been discussing what they do at home to help; linking their learning to the Farmer Duck story. They have really enjoyed making their own model using different junk materials. In maths, they are singing and learning number bonds to 5. The children especially enjoyed their virtual farm visit.

This week, Summers Class have been working hard writing their own superhero stories based around the story 'Send for a Superhero'. They have created their own villains and superheroes and have really enjoyed thinking of how the villains were trying to destroy our school, and how the superheroes managed to stop and capture them. The children have shown that they have fantastic imaginations when they have been writing their stories.

Porthcurnick Class have written dragon descriptions with some excellent similes. They created their own pentatonic melodies on the glockenspiels and thoroughly enjoyed the cricket coaching, but the highlight of the week was definitely making castles from recycled packaging! It was fascinating to see the different ways they constructed their castles, working together to solve challenges such as how to make a working drawbridge.

Portholland Class have been learning about Islam; they have learnt about the five pillars and the importance of daily prayer to Muslims. The children were fascinated by this aspect of religious practice and had many insightful questions. Mr Honour, a student teacher, has joined our class and he has been getting to know the children before he teaches the class later in the term.

Porthluney Class have been learning about The Blitz and writing setting descriptions; they planned each sentence carefully and tried to include all of the SPaG that they have learnt. One of my favourite sentences was 'Our local village exploded into one almighty puzzle.' They have also been adding to their cricket skills with Mr Shaikh, this week learning how to be ferocious fielders.




