

sight	Your eyes let you see all the things around you.

taste	Your sense of taste comes from your tongue. You can tell

	something is warm, cold, smooth or rough
	without even looking at it!



	they grow older. They have smooth, slimy skin
birds	All birds have a beak, two legs, feathers and wings.
carnivore	Animals that mostly eat other animals (meat) are
	carnivores.
fish	Fish live and breathe under water. They have scaly
	skin, fins to help them swim and they breathe through
	gills.
herbivore	Animals that only eat plants are herbivores.
mammals	Mammals are animals that breathe air, grow hair or fur
	and feed on their mother's milk as a baby.
omnivore	Animals that eat both plants and other animals are
	omnivores
reptiles	All reptiles breathe air. They have scales on their skin.
