As a school, we understand and appreciate that unforeseen circumstances can occasionally happen, which results in arriving at school late. However, the gates open at 8.40am and staff use this time to settle their class, work with pupils on the previous day's learning, hear children read and practise a range of skills. Little Carne Nursery have enjoyed exploring Christmas and the story of the Nativity. They have made animal headbands and acted out the story with prompts. All the children have also been busy making Christmas decorations for our tree in the church.

This week, Summers Class have been working on their final geography lesson of the term, thinking about how to improve our school outdoor area. They have drawn their own maps of the school

playground and included new aspects that they would like to see, such as a hot tub, ball pool or a skateboard ramp! In RE, the children had to try to think of what they would give to Jesus if he was born in Tregony today.

In geography this week, Pendower Class have been comparing the UK to Kenya. First, the children located Kenya on the map and they discovered it was on the equator. Then, they compared it to the UK by looking at their physical and human features of geography. The children have also worked incredibly hard when completing their assessments this week.

This week, Porthcurnick Class showed how well they now understand the issues surrounding deforestation in the Amazon rainforest this week and were able to discuss why some people are actually in favour of deforestation. In music, they used the glockenspiels to represent the Canopy and Emergent layers of the rainforest, using different rhythms, pitch and dynamics to create contrasting melodies.

Portholland Class (Y5) have completed their unit of work on fractions and investigated fractions of amounts with...chocolate! They have made beautiful Christmas decorations which they have hung onto the Church tree. In PSHE they have devised and played board games. We are all looking forward to our geography field trip to Truro today.

This week, Porthluney Class have completed their first set of practice SATs; they have shown excellent determination and have had a very positive week - well done! In RE, they have been discussing what a modern version of Mary would be like and they have been writing an informal letter in English based on our text 'Windrush Child'.
