Dear Parent(s)/Carer(s),

As we are in the final term of the year, we inevitably start to consider class structures for next year. On Thursday June 29th, our new reception intake and our existing pupils will spend the day in the class they will be placed in, in September. Our Year 6s will spend the day at The Roseland Academy. As has always been the case, our school has some mixed year groups which means, this year, that some Year 4s will be split between Porthcurnick Class and Portholland Class. We have decided, due to the size of the cohort, that Porthluney will be a Year 6 only class in September 2023. You will receive a letter after half-term, informing you of which teacher/teachers will be teaching in each class and where your child will be placed, as there will be staffing changes due to the restructuring of the Trust's primary schools and maternity leave staff. Our nursery will also be holding an Open Day and will be offering tours on this day for any new children who are looking to start in September. Please see the poster attached below and see a member of our nursery staff if you wish to book a slot.

Little Carne Nursery carried out an investigation about recycling this week after listening to a story called 'Somebody Crunched Collin.' They were able to sort recycling into different materials and reuse it in different ways. They have also enjoyed lots of outdoor play creating locks and channels for boats, creating currents and waves and manipulating the direction of the water.

Towan Class have been working hard this week, producing some fantastic writing. They have been writing about where they would travel if they had a magic carpet and what they would find in a magic box. The children have also been exploring the concept of 'floating and sinking'. They have learnt that if an object has air in it, most of the time it will float. In music, the children have been exploring beats and thoroughly enjoyed making up their own beats using different types of musical instruments.

In history this week, Summers Class have been learning about early trains and the Rainhill Trials, a competition in 1829 to find the best passenger locomotive to take people from Liverpool to Manchester. They all wanted to know who won this competition, and found out that it was Stephenson's 'Rocket' that was the winner.

Pendower Class pupils have been working incredibly hard completing their KS1 SATs. We are very proud of them. In art, they have been looking at lots of maps. Then the children made their own maps using a range of materials including charcoal, crayons and pencils. Please see our class blog for photos.

Porthcurnick class this week have written some excellent new versions of the Mermaid of Zennor, in history, they wrote non-chronological reports on packet ships, they learned some French playground games and in tennis they practised starting a rally with a serve.

Portholland Class have, once again, demonstrated their enthusiasm and knowledge of the Ancient Egyptians. On Wednesday, they had the opportunity to go to The Royal Cornwall Museum where they were able to re-enact the process of mummification, handle and identify artefacts as well as see a real-life mummy! They have also learnt about Ancient Egyptian society and which roles are most important and have made their own papyrus, ready to make a scroll.



This week, our Y6 pupils enjoyed their first sailing trip of the Summer. The children all enjoyed a day at Percuil river where they sailed in small boats. We were impressed to see how well the children worked together to sail. In our art lesson this week, the children explored an evocative painting called 'A Hopeless Dawn' by Frank Bramley. The class were given free-reign to decide what they wrote in response to the painting; some children chose to write poems, which were excellent.
