Communication and Language

- Sing familiar rhymes with actions
- -Talk in short sentences that others can understand.
- Listen to longer stories ad understand what is happening.

- Build relationships with the adults at Nursery.
- Explore emotions in a range of ways.

Physical Developmen

- Use wheeled resources such as trikes and bikes
- Mark make in sensory trays
- Post objects into a small space using pincer grip.

- Repeat words or phrases from familiar stories.
- Clap out syllables in words.
- -Mark make and give meaning to their marks.

- Enjoy a range of Nursery Rhymes.
- Identify their marks when mark making.























The Gruffalo song
