All of our Year 6s are working incredibly hard in class, demonstrating great focus in all aspects of their learning. On Monday, we held a well supported SATs meeting for all parents of Y6 children. Parent feedback was highly positive and they found it very informative and hopefully a little reassuring!

Today, pupils have had a science themed day to celebrate National Science Week. Pupils across the school were set a range of scientific challenges in order to crack a science day message from me!

We have had a highly positive visit from The English Hub who were so impressed by the work of the staff and pupils in Read Write Inc lessons, they do not want to visit again!

We are delighted to welcome Miss Worledge back from her maternity leave, pupils were very pleased to see her. Thank you to Miss Mulroy who has very ably taught the class over the past few weeks.

On Tuesday, I enjoyed being interviewed by members of Portholland Class as part of their geography lesson about how the village has changed over the past forty years. Pupils asked some very interesting questions and were able to discuss the positives and negatives of some of the changes that have taken place.

Little Carne Nursery have been working hard to recognise and understand feelings this week. They have enjoyed reading stories about feelings, especially The Colour Monster. They have also enjoyed our theme for Science week, which is growing. The children have planted new seeds, beans and seedlings as well as making greenhouses for their pots.

Towan Class enjoyed being part of a PSHE lesson where they learnt about not being able to take back unkind words. They enjoyed watching shaving foam being used when an unkind word was said and then physically seeing how it can't go back (can't be taken back). They also enjoyed playing musical instruments to a familiar song. All children listened and participated well.

Summers Class have enjoyed making vehicles this week. They had to remember how wheels work and where and how to attach the axle holder, axle and wheels. Also this week, in geography, they have been learning about dry places and how houses in different countries are made from different materials.

Pendower Class learnt about rivers in geography this week. They located rivers on a map then chose one they wanted to research in more detail. The children then used what they learnt to write an information text about their chosen river. They were very informative and included lots of facts.

Porthcurnick Class started writing their biographies of Nelson Mandela this week. In art, they made their own paint using spices and flour and created group cave wall paintings and, in music, they learned about scat singing and had a go at improvising with their voices.

Portholland Class have been writing up their 'conquering a monster' stories in English, making sure to use all of the features of a story and including some excellent descriptions. In computing, they have been using their computer skills to create artwork based on Bridget Riley's Op art paintings, which use shape as its base.

Porthluney Class learnt about the state of the world's oceans in their geography lesson this week. Tasked with researching facts about the world's five oceans, the children were surprised and saddened to learn how polluted these precious ecosystems have become. They were also fascinated to learn how important our oceans are to the health of our planet and humankind.

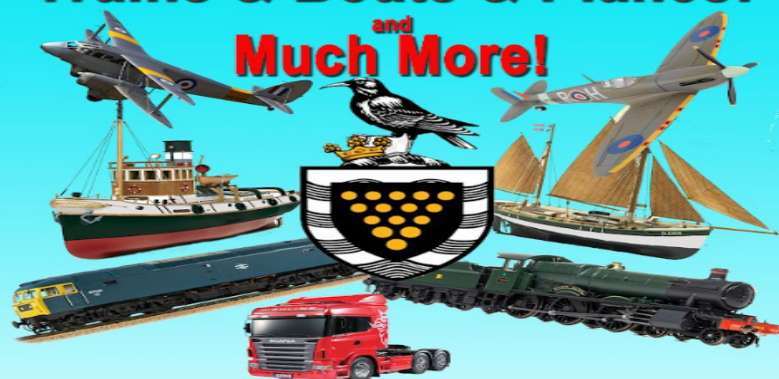
